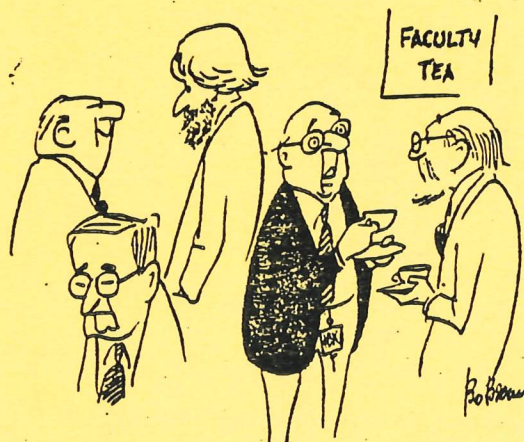

### PARKING STICKERS

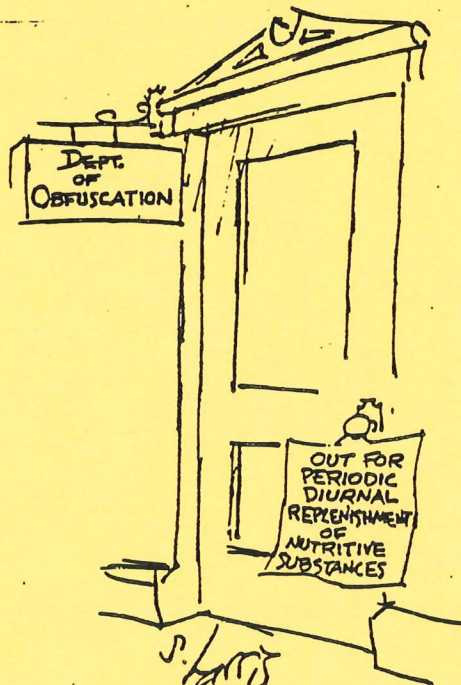

#### LIBRARY UPDATE:

In common with most departments, the library has been plagued by "back orders" for furniture and new equipment, to say nothing of the odd item which failed to materialize after the move from Oak Street to Broadway (anyone seen a library circulation desk?). However ongoing frustrations notwithstanding, we are now in the throes of unpacking the last hundred or so cartons.

PERIODICALS (current and back files) are now being handled and will be available on level 2.

CIRCULATION MATERIALS are all on the shelves on level 3, the bottom shelf of each bay being left to house outsize books from that section.

CLASS SETS, SRA KITS, MASTAI KITS & GAMES are housed at level three.

The PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT library on level 3 will be open as of July 1st. This section will also include the TEAL Mel Hendersen Collection which for the past few years has been held at the Britannia Library Learning Resource Centre. The AUDIO LAB (level 2) is fully functional, and available for use during normal library hours.

The PREVIEW ROOM can be booked ahead of time (call Film Booking at local 433), but for the greater part of each day is available for instant use.

The LIBRARY FOR THE VISUALLY IMPAIRED (level 2) will be set up during the summer and will be operational by September. This area will be treated as a "reserve collection" and includes Braille, Large Print, Talking Book and other special format materials.



FROM THE RUNNING CORNER

Once again it is time for the Labatt's 24-Hour Relay sponsored by Labatt's Brewery and the Seawall Running Society to raise money for the B.C. Lion's Society for Crippled Children.

Last year V.C.C. fielded one team with seventeen runners. This year we have entered two teams with forty runners. Each campus has representation on the teams from faculty, staff and students with the occasional administrator. There are also a few friends of V.C.C. taking part to add flavour to the mix.

The Relay will take place on June 18 - 19th at Swangard Stadium in Burnaby, from 10:00 a.m. Saturday to 10:00 a.m. Sunday. This year over 100 teams will take part for a total of over 2,000 runners, not to mention "pit crews" and spectators (there were over 2,000 supporters in the stands last year). Each team is sponsored by pledges to raise money for the Lion's Crippled Children's Fund. Individuals sponsor a team at so much per mile. What a person has to pay is determined by the total number of miles the team collectively runs over the 24 hour period. Last year for example, the V.C.C. team ran approximately 200 miles in 24 hours. If you had sponsored the team at 10¢ per mile you were billed \$10.00 by the Lion's Club. Everything over \$5.00 gets you a tax receipt.

What we need now is your support, both in terms of pledges and in terms of volunteers to help our twelve person "pit crew". If you are prepared to help out financially, please contact Gordon Pawelchak, Rita Shelley, Phyllis Butler or Peter Hopkinson at K.E.C.; Richard Vedan or Pasqualle Pascucci at Langara; John Spencer, Dalton Kramer, Bill Edwards or Dick Kirkham at V.V.I. - all have pledge sheets and will be glad to sign you up. If you want to be a volunteer, contact Rita Shelley at K.E.C.

The Relay is a lot of fun, it raises money for a good cause (close to a quarter of a million dollars last year and we expect more this year) and certainly gets good P.R. for the College. What more can we say? We are counting on your support. If you have some time, drop by the stadium and give the team vocal encouragement. We will have a section of the stands reserved for you, so watch for the Club banner.
