
FACULTY AND STAFF MEETING

Plan to Partake in the Pancake Phantasamagorial.



LIBRARY FINES AND OVERDUES:

Starting January 3rd, we will revert to normal procedures, which may include passing names to a Collection Agency for those who ignore requests to return material.



ENVIRONMENTAL UPDATE

At the Monday meeting of the Senior Facilities Committee, it was reported that the time required to complete the extension of the diesel exhaust would be two weeks.

Keen Engineering advised that the use of precipitators in the Auto-Body shop would not be a good application of this type equipment. It was recommended that the overhead doors to the shop be kept closed to preclude the rest of fumes discharged from the Auto Body shop reaching any air intake.

To address the vibration/reverberation problems being reported on the 2nd and 3rd floor areas above the diesel operations, it was decided that isolating padding would be installed under diesel engines. It was agreed that once the extended stack is in place, acoustic consultants would be engaged to review the matter. The installation of filters (alumina potassium parmanganate or charcoal) on the intakes would be very costly. The proposal to extend the air intakes on the north side upwards and along the roof towards the south would be unsightly. Because the final air analysis reports from the W.C.B. and the College consultant, have not yet been received, it was decided to defer action regarding the intakes.

Preliminary reports regarding the quality of air fail to detect anything alarming. Keen Engineering are preparing a design for an exhaust system associated with running of the dynamometer in the Auto Mechanics' area. Buildings and Grounds will carry out the work pending approval of the drawing for the hook-up exhaust for the open truck bay of the diesel area.


