The Vancouver Community College Board announces that it has accepted, with great regret, the resignation of A. S. (Tony) Manera as President and Chief Executive Officer of the College, effective February 28, 1985.

Mr. Manera is leaving the College to pursue a career opportunity in "an exciting field outside education." In accepting his resignation the Board wished Mr. Manera great success in his future career.

Mr. Manera was appointed Chief Executive Officer of the College effective February 21, 1978. Prior to joining VCC he had served for six years as President of Niagara College in Ontario. Mr. Manera's career in education will have spanned a total of twenty years when he moves into his new field.

While announcing Mr. Manera's departure, Peter H. Hebb, Chairman of the College Board, thanked him on behalf of the Board for his seven years of distinguished service to the College and the community.

Mr. Hebb stated "I know I speak on behalf of all members of the College community in saying we will miss him."

Mr. Hebb also announced that the search process to find a new President will begin immediately.

The Board has established a search committee comprised of the Vice-Chairman of the Board, Mrs. Elizabeth Jarvis, and Board Member, Mrs. Barbara Spitz and representatives appointed by various constituent groups within the College.

The Personnel Committee of the Board has been authorized to oversee the search process on behalf of the Board. The search committee will recommend a "short-list" of candidates to the new College Board who shall make the final selection of a new president.

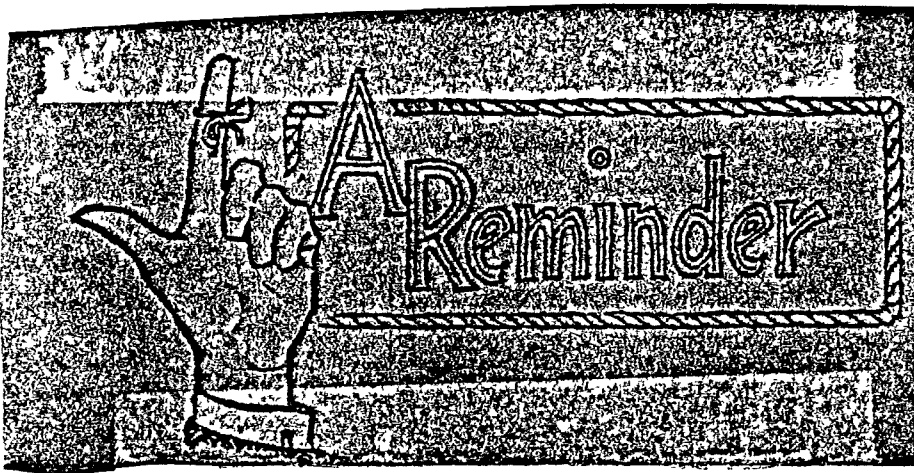

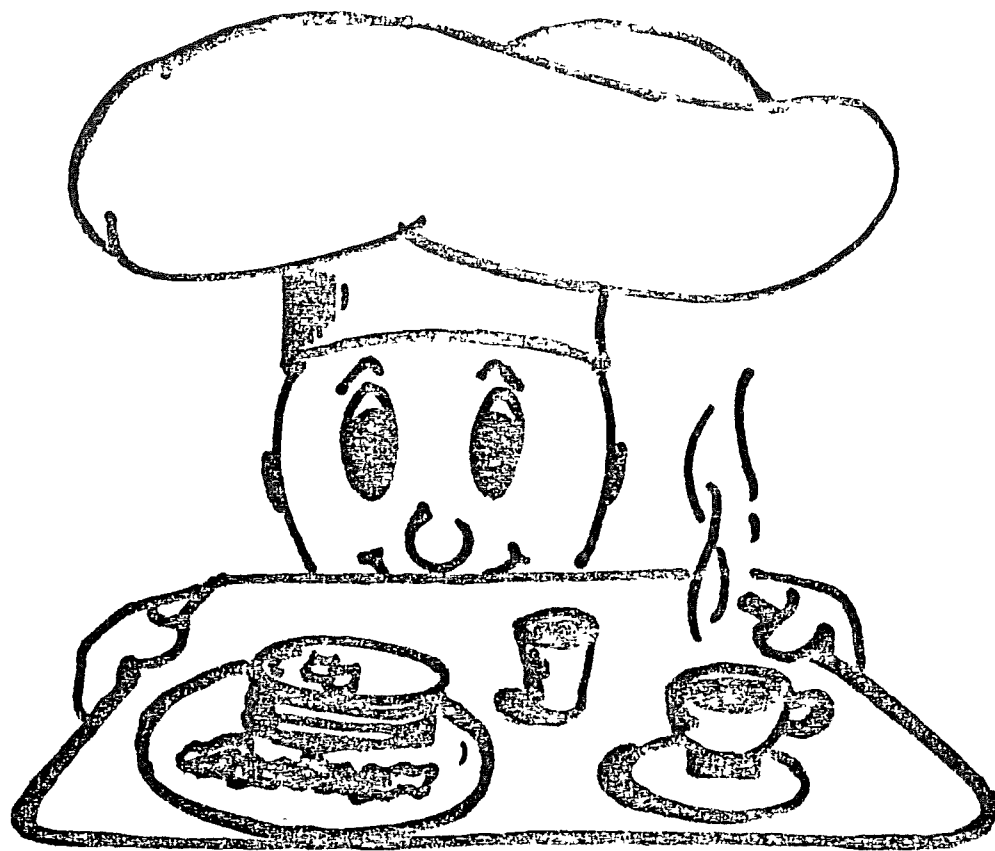
