Tony Hunt is the grandson of one of the most famous of all west coast artists, the legendary Chief Mungo Martin. Re: Superannuation Commission Field Trips
to the Lower Mainland

Representatives from the Superannuation Commission travel to the Lower Mainland once every month, except August, to meet employees and employers covered under the various pension plans that the Commission administers. These trips usually take place on either the first or second Thursday and Friday of each month. For the months of January through March 1986, the interviews are scheduled to be held at Burnaby Mental Health Centre on the Thursday afternoon and at the Public Service Commission in downtown Vancouver on the Friday morning; for the months of April through December 1986, they are scheduled to be held at the Ministry of Transportation and Highways Regional Office in Burnaby.

The main objective of these visits is to provide personal counselling to employees who are contemplating retirement within the next year or two. However, the Superannuation Commission is also prepared to schedule interviews with employer representatives to discuss various features of the pension plans and the Commission policies and procedures.

A supply of "Application for Half-Hour Personal Interview" forms is enclosed. If additional forms are required, please request them from this office. In order to ensure that a request for an interview will be considered, the request must reach the Superannuation Commission at least two months prior to the required interview date.

Your cooperation is requested in making your employees aware of our intended visits. Please post a sample "Application for Half-Hour Personal Interview" form in a prominent place.
