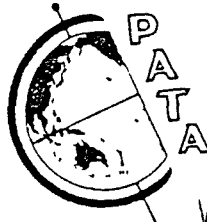
A NEW SCHOLARSHIP

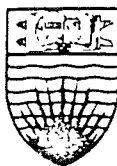
