Applications are invited from all disciplines in the natural, medical and social sciences and humanities as well as in engineering.

Letters of intent must be submitted to the Inter-Council Directorate no later than September 30, 1988. The deadline for submission of applications is November 30, 1988.

SAVINGS PLAN BULLETIN

Effective September 1, 1988 the Vancouver Employees' (Deferred) Savings Plan will be administered by Vancouver City Savings Credit Union. VanCity offers the benefits of local administration and decision-making (the record-keeping and processing will take place at their Head Office at 10th & Cambie) as well as an Ethical Growth Fund option, quarterly statements and an annual participants' seminar. We look forward to the improvements in service.

As a result of this change and the process of exchanging records between Royal Trust and VanCity there will be some disruption in service during the month of September. Please make note of the following:

- 1. Withdrawals WILL NOT be processed from September 1 to October 1. If you had planned on withdrawing funds in September please ensure that you apply for a withdrawal prior to the 15th of August (for a cheque from Royal Trust on September 1). The first cheques from the VanCity system will be issued on or after October 15th (based on a withdrawal form filled out prior to September 30).
- 2. Transfers between funds are normally allowed at the end of each quarter (e.g. September 30). Transfers will be suspended until the next quarter (i.e. December 31).
- 3. The Ethical Growth Fund option will not be available to transfer into until December 31.

There will be additional changes to get accustomed to including new forms, new phone numbers, two sets of T-3's for 1988 (one from Royal Trust, one from VanCity) and a new, easier-to-understand, quarterly statement. The Board of Nominees, Personnel/Payroll Departments and VanCity appreciate your patience and understanding over the next few months.
