ACCOLADES FOR THE COUNSELLING DEPARTMENT



At the request of the Ministry of Education, Brunei Darussalam, ACCC is inviting applications for 4 POSITIONS as Program Planners.

- assist in elaborating an effective selection system for prospective vocational college students from the secondary schools; and
- assist in the development and implementation of a Program Planning Unit.
