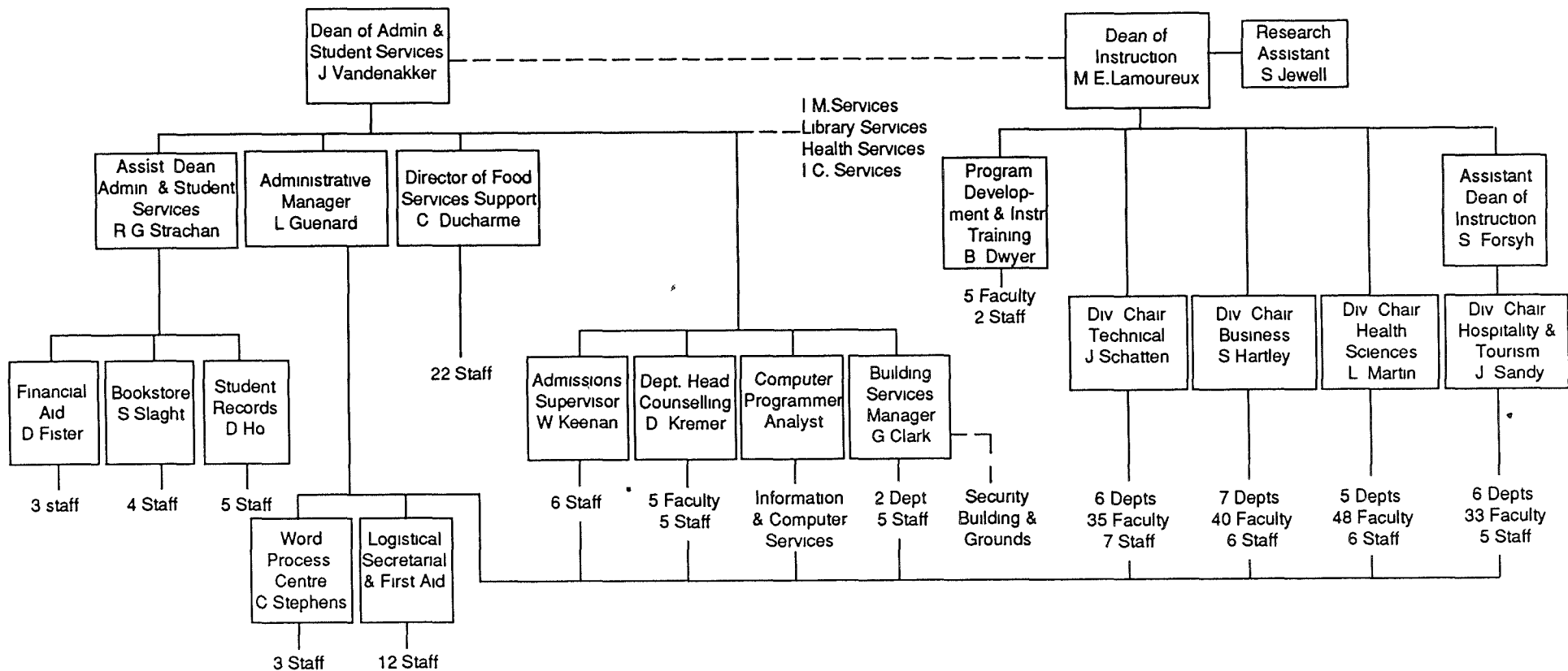

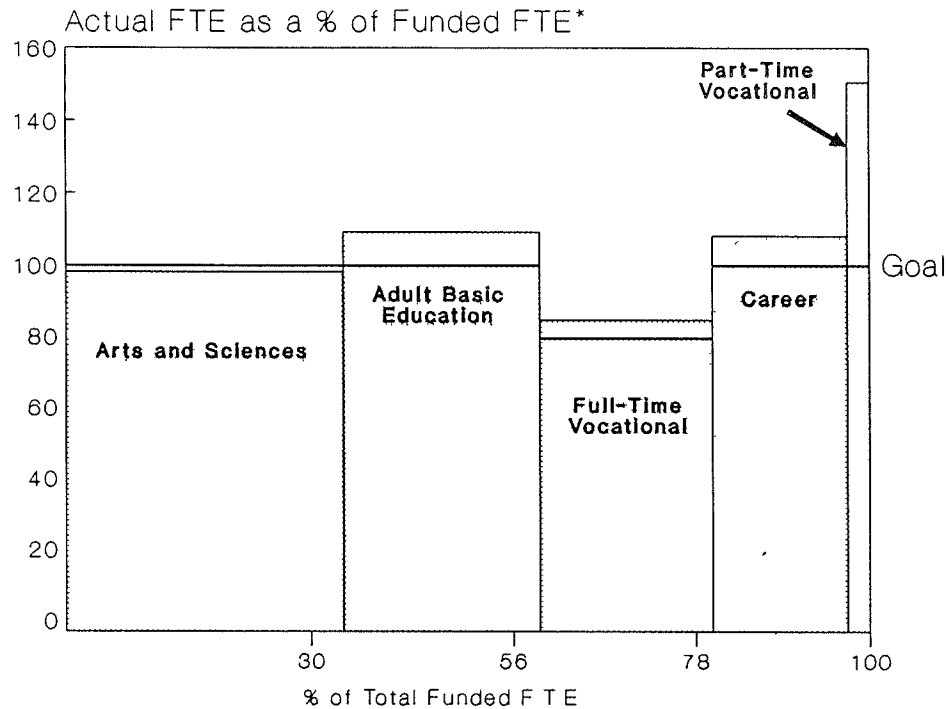
III. Main Enrollment Adjustments for 1990/91:

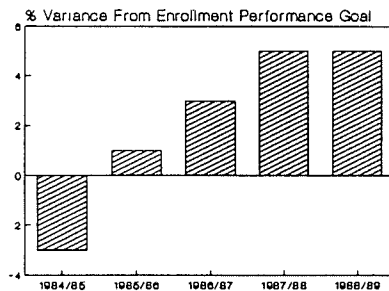
We taught more students, in 1988/89, than we were funded to teach

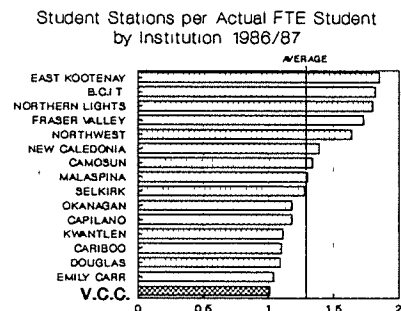

...and our enrollment performance has continued to improve



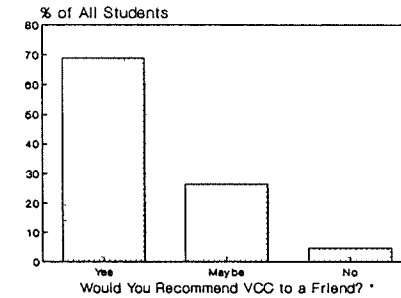

We are especially short of space for our students...



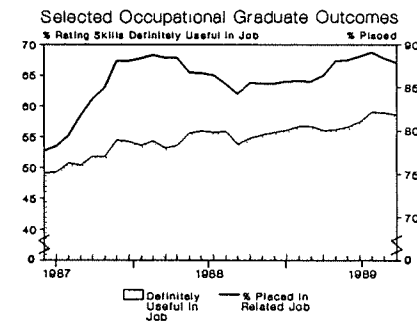
