

High tech is the new language of car talk


The computer evolution has transformed the garage grease monkey with busted knuckles into a whitecoattechnician with electronic interrogation on his mind.

Ulrich, a two-time Juno Award winner who has toured Canada and the U.S., is currently releasing her fourth solo album, "Every Road".


The Melloyds are Vancouver's "shoobop" quartet, noted for blending their a cappella harmonies and original arrangements with favourites from the 50s and 60s.
